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| Unit Title: Spanish – The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe | |
| Assessments: | Mini-quiz, teacher assessment during lessons, especially for Year 3 as the NC only specifies children to be able to verbalise Spanish words so teacher assessment is key here. |
| Links to prior learning: | The children will have looked at months in Spanish in Autumn 1 so will be able to relate that to the seasons. |
| Link across units: | This term LKS2 are reading The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe. This unit looks at seasons and weather (Geography), the celebration of Christmas (RE). |

Does Spain have any different traditions at Christmas?</p> <p><u>World Around Us</u> How do different countries around the world celebrate Christmas? Do all the countries in the world have the same seasons in the same months?</p> <p><u>World Beyond Us</u> Do any other planets have seasons similar to the ones we have in Earth? How do astronauts celebrate Christmas?</p> <p><u>Modern Britain</u> Are the seasons changing? What affect does pollution and global warming have on the weather?</p> <p><u>Healthy Body Healthy Mind</u> What foods are traditionally eaten in Spain at Christmas? Do the seasons affect what sports we play and when we play them? Are there any trends in sports in the UK because of the seasons or weather?</p> <p><u>Technology in Action</u> How has technology changed the way we predict the weather? How has technology helped us celebrate Christmas with family in other countries?</p> |
