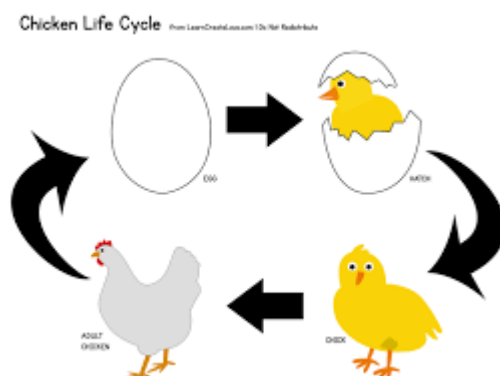

Wednesday 24th February 2021 Activity 3

VIP's

Adding yeast makes dough rise.

Bread is one of the world's oldest foods.

It takes 9 seconds for a combine to harvest enough wheat to make about 70 loaves of bread.

It's time to have a go at making your own bread, just like the Little Red Hen.

You will need:

1kg white bread flour

2 sachets of dried yeast

2 tbsp vegetable oil

550 – 600ml water

Extra flour and oil for dusting and brushing

Pinch of salt

Follow the instructions from the sheet that follows.

Deepen the moment (challenge)

Write a set of instructions for making bread.



The Little Red Hen Bread Rolls Recipe Sheet

Ingredients

1kg white bread flour
2 sachets of dried yeast
2 tbsp vegetable oil
550-600ml water
Extra flour and oil for dusting
and brushing
Pinch of salt

Equipment

Large mixing bowl
Sieve
Tablespoon
Teaspoon
Wooden Spoon
Cling Film
Measuring jug
Scales
Pastry brush
Scissors
Baking tray
Wire rack



Method

1. Weigh the flour and sieve into the large bowl.
2. Add the salt and dried yeast, spoon in the oil, add the water.
3. Mix the oil and water into the flour with the wooden spoon until the dough is soft but not sticky. If it is too wet, add some more flour, if it is too dry add a bit more water.
4. Turn the dough onto a board or a clean work surface.
5. Knead by pulling and rolling the dough backwards and forwards.
6. Keep kneading for 8 to 10 minutes until the dough is smooth and springy.
7. Put back in the mixing bowl and cover with an oiled piece of cling film.
8. Leave the dough in a warm place for at least an hour until it has doubled in size and feels spongy. (The cling film allows you and the children to see what is happening!)
9. Tip the dough out on the board and knead for a minute or two.
10. Divide the dough into roll-sized portions and form into tight balls.
11. Bake for 12 to 15 minutes at 200°C.

There is a template attached for you to use if you would like or you can be a little more creative and make your own.

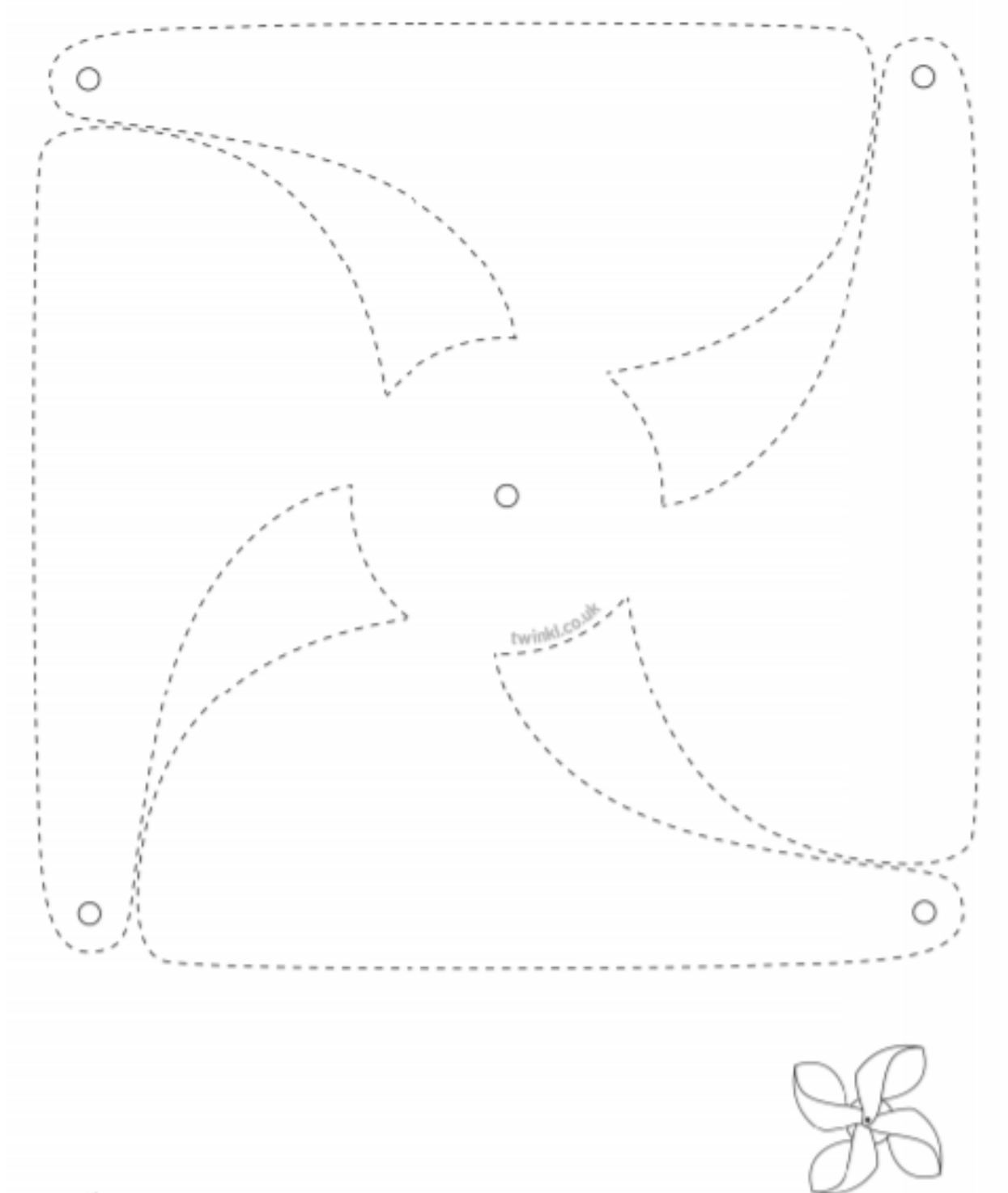
When you have made it, why not put it in your garden and see if it turns around in the wind.

Printable Pinwheel





Printable Pinwheel

You will need:

- Pinwheel template
- Scissors
- Colouring pens or pencils
- Drawing pin
- Wooden dowel (approximately 30cm long)
- Sticky tack

What to do:

- Colour in the pinwheel template on both sides.
- Cut out the pinwheel template along the dotted lines.
- Fold the small circles at the ends of the sails in to meet the small circle at the centre of the pinwheel.
- Carefully push the drawing pin through all the small circles at the centre.
- Place the dowel behind the pinwheel and push the drawing pin into the dowel to secure the pinwheel to its handle. Don't push the drawing pin in too tightly, or the pinwheel won't spin.
- Check the back of the dowel to ensure the sharp end of the drawing pin is not sticking out. Place some sticky tack over it if it is.

Now test your pinwheel outside on a windy day!
