Support Services

The services outlined in this section are designed to provide targeted support to children and young people in a familiar, accessible environment. These interventions range from emotional wellbeing and mental health support to behaviour guidance, learning strategies, and early intervention around risky or concerning behaviours. Access to these services is typically coordinated through the school's pastoral support teams or Inclusion Leaders, who are best placed to identify emerging needs and liaise with relevant professionals. By embedding support within the school day, we aim to remove barriers to access and ensure that students receive timely help that compliments their academic and personal development. If you feel your child would benefit from any of the services listed, please contact the school's Inclusion Lead or Pastoral Team in the first instance.

0-19 Healthy Young People (School Nursing)

Support with sleep, health, mental health, smoking, weight, eating etc. Wednesdays 1:1 prearranged appointments, drop-in from 12.05–1.05 Referral form required.

BEAM

Exercise-based anger management programme.

Sessions in school every term.

Referral form required.

CAMHS

Mental health support for under 18s. Includes mulitple sectors for all areas of mental health including:

- Primary intervention team.
- CAMHS core team.
- Eating disorder team.
- Enhanced outreach team.
- REACH (previously crisis team).

Appointments via parents, held in school or CAMHS offices. Referral via Single Point Of Access or online form.

Future In Mind (FIM)

Low-level mental health support for students experiencing anxiety or worries.

Appointments happen in school.

Referral via TAS or a separate referral.

Listening Service

Low-level 'listening ear' for students once a week. Not a trained counsellor. Mondays 10.20–11.40.

Turning Point

Drug support for under 18s, Hidden Harm programme, and 18+ counselling.

1:1 appointments in school or at home.
